Article IV SEC Amendment #6

Repeal Article IV of the New York State Constitution Replace with the following:

Article IV: Votes in State Chapter

Section 1: Purposes: The State Chapter shall meet to:

- a) To formulate and decide all matters of policy for the State Chapter.
- b) To provide advice and consent to the State Executive Committee.
- c) To be the clearing house and the body of origin for all amendments to the State Chapter Constitution and By-laws.
 - d) To nominate and elect the officers of the State Chapter.

Section 2: Membership:

- 1. Good Standing
 - a) The membership of the State Chapter shall be all Chapters located in the Jurisdiction of New York, which are either chartered or operating under Letters Temporary.
 - b) All Chapters are considered to be in good standing with the State Chapter and the Congress unless they are delinquent in one of the following:
 - i. Filing of an Annual Advisory Council Registration
 - ii. Filing of Form 10s
 - iii. Filing of Officer Address Reports
 - iv. Paying their annual Insurance Premium, if any is assessed.
 - v. Holding of an Annual Meeting of the Chapter Advisory Council
 - vi. Filing of an annual Financial Statement
 - vii. Meet all other requirements of a chapter in good standing as set forth in the By-laws, Rules and Regulations of DeMolay International
 - viii. Hosting a youth protection program at least once every six months and providing notice.

ix. In any other manner determined by the Executive Officer and State

Master Councilor

2. Voting Delegates

- a) Definition: Each Chapter that meets the definition in Section 2 shall be eligible to have voting delegates provided:
 - i. The chapter has at least one Active DeMolay and one Advisor registered and present at the meeting of the State Chapter.
 - ii. The chapter has completed the New York DeMolay Voter

Registration Form with the State Executive Committee by the deadline.

lii. Each Chapter is entitled to three votes and may have one person

cast all of their votes. (takes out v. Each delegate is allowed one vote. If a chapter has only one delegate they forfeit the other two. If only two delegates they forfeit the other one.)

iii. Each Chapter is entitled to up to three votes and must have a

Commented [PWB6]: NOTE: This was a debate within the State Executive Committee on how votes should be counted. One proposal gives every chapter 3 votes

regardless of the number of people present at convention. The other gives every chapter 3 votes if they have 3 DeMolays qualified to vote present, 2 votes if they have 2 DeMolays qualified to vote present, 1 vote if they have 1 DeMolay qualified to vote present.

The State Executive Committee feels that this is a question best settled by the voting membership of New York

iv. Delegates will elect a Region Master Councilor for their Region only.

v. Each delegate is allowed one vote. If a chapter has only one

delegate they forfeit the other two. If only two delegates they forfeit the other one

vi. If a delegate has dual membership, that delegate can only represent and be a delegate for one Chapter

b) Qualifications: Delegates desiring to vote at the State Chapter in the Annual/Special State Meeting must:

- i. Have completed their obligation proficiency
- ii. Be in good standing with their Chapters

iii. Be a Councilor or a duly designated proxy. If no Councilor is present,

an Active DeMolay may be a proxy for the chapter votes.

Commented [PWB7]: NOTE: The State Executive Committee debated this and made the decision that who the chapter sends as delegates is up to the chapter membership.
